APPEALS COURT BACKS DISMISSED CLAIMS TIED TO ZAYAT SUIT

The Kentucky Court of Appeals in a unanimous Nov. 12 order upheld circuit court rulings that dismissed claims made by a New York investment firm against farms and individuals that bought breeding rights and horses from Zayat Stables.

MGG Investment Group is embroiled in a fraud and breach of contract lawsuit against Zayat Stables that borrowed around \$30 million from the firm and used its equine assets as collateral, including nine breeding rights to 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah. Beginning in 2017, Zayat began selling some of its assets and did not notify MGG about these transactions.

Zayat sold the following: stallion prospect El Kabeir to Yeomanstown Stud for \$500,000; grade 1-placed American Cleopatra (a full sister to American Pharoah) sold privately to Hill 'n' Dale Farm for \$1.3 million; the breeding rights to American Pharoah to LNJ Foxwoods (two rights) and Orpendale (seven rights) for \$3.3 million; breeding rights to the grade 3-placed, stakes winner Lemoona to Flintshire Farm and Brad Sears for \$150,000; and a 50% interest in the stallion Solomini to McMahon of Saratoga for \$125,000.

Zayat eventually defaulted on its loans with MGG in September 2019 and when a liquidation agreement could not be reached, MGG filed its suit Jan. 21, 2020. About three weeks later, MGG amended its complaint

to include the farms and individuals that purchased the horses and breeding rights. During February and March a parade of motions to dismiss were filed by the buyers and subsequently all granted by Fayette (Ky.) Circuit Court Judge Kimberly Bunnell largely on the same legal grounds.

A provision in the U.S. Food Security Act states: "a buyer who in the ordinary course of business buys a farm product from a seller engaged in farming operations shall take free of a security interest created by the seller, even though the security interest is perfected; and the buyer knows of the existence of such interest."

Also under the Food Security Act, Kentucky is a "direct notice" state, which means MGG was required to meet specific "direct notice" requirements in order to secure its interest in the horses or breeding rights.

Bunnell's orders noted that MGG did not comply with those requirements.

In the case of Yeomanstown Stud, Bunnell did dismiss the charges without prejudice (meaning not permanently dismissed and with the option of being brought back to court) because she felt MGG's claim might be entitled to a condition known as "equitable tolling," which is related to statute of limitation restrictions. Any legal action related to the taking of personal property must begin within two years of the alleged taking. Yeomanstown bought El Kabeir from Zayat Stables Sept. 20, 2017, and MGG filed its complaint against Yeomanstown Feb. 11, 2020, more than four months after the statute of limitations expired.

MGG argued in its appeal that the clock on the statute of limitations should have started not when the transaction occurred but when MGG discovered it had occurred. Courts make some allowance with lawsuits filed after the statute of limitations deadline if—in this case the sale of El Kabeir—MGG could not have readily discovered the sale.

The appeals court found, however, that MGG "with reasonable diligence" could have learned about the sale of El Kabeir because it had the authority to visit, examine, or inspect Zayat Stables' equine assets or request equine appraisals at any time at Zayat Stables' expense.

"MGG's failure to exercise these inspection rights is fatal to any claim that the injury it suffered was 'inherently unknowable' within the statutory period," the appeals court wrote in its order.

The appellate court order affirmed the dismissals of all claims against Hill 'n' Dale, LNJ Foxwoods, McMahon, Orpendale, Flintshire, Sears, and Bemak N.V., which is an overseas company that facilitates transactions for Orpendale and Ashford Stud. The court also sent the Yeomanstown motion to dismiss back to the circuit court for it to issue a judgment dismissing all claims with prejudice, meaning the action is permanent and cannot be revisited.

Zavat Stables was put under the management of court-appointed receiver Elizabeth Woodward starting Jan. 22, 2020. With assistance of Gatewood Bell, Woodward cataloged the stable's assets, handled bills related to the stable, and maximized the value of the horses through racing, training, and sales. As of April 2020, Zayat Stables owned 32 horses kept in 17 different locations and had ownership interests in another 15 that Woodward had to track down, according to her reports. In Woodward's most recent report filed Feb. 16, 2021, Zayat Stables was down to two horses. She had collected, as of Dec. 31, 2020, approximately \$1,716,215 in purse proceeds and sales and spent \$1,136,775 on board bills, training fees, veterinary bills, and costs and commission associated with sales. Because Ahmed Zayat filed for Chapter 7 bankruptcy in New Jersey, any net proceeds are turned over to the bankruptcy trustee. BH

HONG KONG WOULD HAVE REFUNDED BC JUVENILE TURF WAGERS

Considering the Hong Kong Jockey Club typically does things the right way—especially when it comes to issues of integrity and fairness to horseplayers—the fact it would have handled this year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1T) situation in a different manner should be telling.

With its strong track record in place, it's no surprise that the HKJC frowned on how California officials handled the Juvenile Turf where Modern Games initially was scratched at the gate before being allowed to run for purse money only. That decision shifted the outcome of millions of dollars in wagers from a horse that registered a clear victory, Modern Games, to a decisively defeated runner-up in Tiz the Bomb.

Talking with the South China Morning Post, HKJC chief executive Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges said if the club had offered separate-pool simulcast wagering on the race, all bets would have been refunded.

"I think it is something which is definitely of concern," Engelbrecht-Bresges said in a Sam Agars column published Nov. 8. "We had a discussion and we informed the Breeders' Cup after the incident that we respect the rules they have but that if something like this would happen with our simulcast races, we would void the race and pay back the bets as our customers would not accept it."

This year marked the first time since 2014 that the HKJC accepted wagers on United States races, as the club offered betting on the Longines Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T) and the FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile Presented by PDJF (G1T) Nov. 6 at Del Mar. The South China Morning Post reports a total of HK\$23,501,105 (\$3.02 million) was wagered on the two races simulcast Nov. 6, with the HKJC wanting to acknowledge the move to a Breeders' Cup free of race-day medication.

While the HKJC did not offer wagering on the Juvenile Turf, and Engelbrecht-Bresges made it clear in the


column that the HKJC is still interested in simulcasting future U.S. races, it's also clear the rules and decisions surrounding the Juvenile Turf would have put the club in an awkward position if it had accepted wagers on that Nov. 5 race.

Breeders' Cup not only saw wagering offered on two of its races in Hong Kong this year, it also saw the Japan Racing Association allow wagering on the Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T), Turf, and Mile. Japan bettors wagered \$12,504,906 on those three races.

Both Japan and Hong Kong restrict the number of international races available for wagering in their countries. Racing officials in both countries cited the move by the Breeders' Cup toward the international standard of prohibiting race-day medication in its races as a big reason to offer these races in their countries. With the launch of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority scheduled for July as U.S. racing overall moves toward the international standards, more good feelings should flow on that front.

As we see more revenue streams opened through international wagering on U.S. races, I suspect we could soon see a push for more consistent wagering rules and enforcement from country to country—similar to the efforts to synchronize medication rules. As the U.S. typically seems to be lagging when it comes to protecting horseplayers, such a move would be welcomed. BH

HISA COMMITTEE CHAIRS TO SPEAK AT SYMPOSIUM ON RACING

Less than a year ago, historic bipartisan legislation to modernize the regulation of Thoroughbred racing was passed into law. For the first time in the history of the sport, the legislation provided a national framework to ensure a single set of rules and enforcement mechanisms to govern medication use and track safety.

Last week, the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority and the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency released the first tranche of new, draft regulations for public review and input. Three of the six documents pertaining to the Anti-Doping and Medication Control Program, drafted by USADA, have been posted, including the proposed Equine Protocol, Prohibited List, and Definitions. In addition, and separate from USADA's work, rules relating to the Racetrack Safety Program also have been posted for public review. Additional documents are expected to be posted next week.

In concert with the rules submission to the Federal Trade Commission for review (which will include an additional public comment period) and approval, members of the racing community will have the opportunity to hear from HISA's chairman of the board of directors, Charles Scheeler, Anti-Doping and Medication Control Committee chair Adolpho Birch, along with Racetrack Safety Committee chair Susan Stover at the University of Arizona's 47th Annual Global Symposium on Racing.

The Tuesday, Dec. 7 sessions mark the HISA leadership's first participation in a public forum following meetings with nearly 30 racing organizations, track operators, state racing commissions, and others over the past two months to shape the new rules.



At the symposium, HISA officials will outline the draft rules and regulations, the timelines they and industry stakeholders have been working under, and discuss implications for racing participants, regulators, and fans.

"We're thrilled to be joining leaders from across racing at the University of Arizona to discuss HISA and the future of racing. Our teams have been hard at work, listening, consulting, and taking in feedback from experts. The rulemaking process will be ongoing, and we encourage industry stakeholders, racing fans, and the general public to review and comment through our website," Scheeler said. "While the FTC will authorize the final set of rules for the official launch of the Authority in July 2022, it is the Authority's full intention to continue to work with the industry to evolve and improve the rules beyond that time.

"The past year has made it all too clear that the current patchwork of regulations across multiple state racing jurisdictions, along with their corresponding adjudication processes, are inefficient and out-ofdate. In just two weeks' time, the Global Racing Symposium will provide a glimpse into how the Authority, the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency, and the FTC will work with the horse racing industry to modernize regulation of the sport." BH

JACK CHRISTOPHER TO RESUME TRAINING IN EARLY 2022

Jack Christopher, one of the top 2-year-olds in the country and a prospect for next year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), had a screw inserted in a left shin last week by orthopedic surgeon Dr. Larry Bramlage, said Bradley Weisbord, racing manager for some of the colt's connections.

The Chad Brown-trained Munnings colt, owned by Jim Bakke, Gerald Isbister, Coolmore Stud, and Peter Brant, was scratched the day before the Nov. 5 TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile Presented by Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (G1) at Del Mar on the advice of Breeders' Cup veterinarians. He was the morning-line favorite.

"Due to a couple areas lighting up (on a bone scan), mainly the left shin, he had a procedure done on that shin and he's going to be out for two months," said Weisbord, a bloodstock agent whose clients include Bakke and Isbister. "So we will start him back (training) in early 2022 at WinStar Farm

and then ship him to Palm Meadows and start his campaign in South Florida."

Jack Christopher, winner of the Champagne Stakes (G1), is already rehabbing at WinStar, Weisbord said.

Also receiving time off for Brown is Klaravich Stables' Domestic Spending, who was withdrawn from the Nov. 6 Longines Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T). He is out for a minimum of three months while he recovers from a suspensory ligament injury, Brown told Daily Racing Form. BH

\$205K MARE IN FOAL TO GUN RUNNER TOPS KEENELAND SESSION Bu Lauren Cash

The More Than Ready mare De la Soul measured up as an excellent buy for Cecil Seaman Nov. 16, as the agent shopped for his longtime client Jon Marshall at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. In foal to Gun Runner and believed to be carrying a colt due in February, the unraced 3-year-old brought \$205,000 to top the Tuesday session.

"This mare will go to Pennsylvania to foal out," Seaman said. "Being in foal to Gun Runner was part of the attraction, along with

her biomechanics; she measured well."

Shack Parrish of Indian Creek congratulated Cecil

and Sally Seaman after they signed the ticket for the bay mare, commenting: "You got her for 20% off!"

Consigned by Indian Creek, agent, as Hip 2454, De la Soul is carrying her first foal. She was bred in Kentucky by Blue Heaven Farm, which acquired her dam, The Crane (by Tiznow), from the 2016 Keeneland November sale for \$290,000 in foal to Uncle Mo from Paramount Sales' consignment.

Further down the page, Hennessy's grade 1 winner Harmony Lodge is found as the second dam, an \$851,120 earner for Eugene and Laura Melnyk. She has produced grade 3 winner and sire Stratford Hill and grade 2-placed stakes winner Armistice Day.

At the conclusion of Tuesday's seventh session, Keeneland reported 299 horses sold for gross receipts of \$9,455,400, an average price of \$31,623, and a median of \$23,000. The RNA rate of 11.5% represents 39 horses that failed to meet their reserve.

In 2020 at the same session, 274 horses sold for a total of \$5,424,800, an average of \$19,799, a median of \$12,500, and an RNA rate of 10.2%.

The cumulative gross is \$189,865,000 for 1,735 horses sold at an average price of \$109,432 and a median of \$60,000, with 351 horses failing to meet their reserve at a 16.8% RNA rate.

Comparatively, cumulative sales through the seventh session in 2020 grossed \$146,849,200, with 1,592 horses sold for an average price of \$92,242 and a median of \$42,000, with an 18.1% RNA rate.

A colt by Not This Time consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent, was the session's highestpriced weanling, bringing \$150,000 from a new partnership in Stony Pointe Farm. Jim Fitzgerald and Bill Baxter, DVM, sat inside the pavilion eager to acquire the colt, making a quartet of purchases for their partners throughout the sale.

"We anticipated he might go to \$150,000; he's a very nice colt and very athletic," Baxter said. "This is a brand new pinhooking partnership with some new folks we are introducing to the sport. We are very excited to be able to get this nice horse for them."

Stony Point Farm/Bloodstock purchased a Vino Rosso colt, Hip 537, from the first day of selling of Book 2 from the Elm Tree Farm consignment for \$75,000. They came back the next day to add Hip 613, a Mitole colt consigned by Paramount Sales for \$20,000. Taylor Made Sales Agency consigned a Constitution colt as Hip 1652 from Book 3, who fetched \$120,000 from the new partnership.

"Horses have been hard to come by; it's a very competitive sale," said Baxter, a vet based in Grand Rapids, MI.

Taylor Made Sales Agency was the session's leading consignor, selling 25 horses for a gross of \$1,257,000,

at an average of \$50,280.

"If I were to sum up the market today, it would be very fair," said Denali Stud vice president Conrad Bandoroff. "The mare market continues to be strong. Coming into it, I don't think anyone expected the strength we are seeing in the mare market. I know my expectation coming into the sales was we would see strong demand on the foals, given the strength of this year's yearling market. I think what we are seeing is not only the foal market being good and strong, but there is an appetite for mares, and people have a lot of confidence."

Pat Costello, managing officer of Paramount Sales, which sells 30 head in Book 5 and five horses of racing age said: "We are having mares come up to the ring with low reserves and they are tripling their reserve price. If you bring them up with reasonable reserves, they are selling."

Wark Bloodstock purchased two weanlings Tuesday for total receipts of \$215,000 to be the session's leading buyer. A daughter of Audible consigned as Hip 2399 by Taylor Made Sales Agency brought \$130,000 from Wark to be the day's highest-priced weanling filly.

Out of Bide a Wee Island (by Sligo Bay), a winner in Canada, the filly is a half sister to Island Commish, winner on the grass in the Kitten's Joy Stakes (G3T) at Gulfstream Park and second in the Franklin-Simpson Stakes (G3) at Kentucky Downs, both of 2020.

WinStar Farm stallion Audible, a son of Into Mischief whose first foals are weanlings of 2021, has seen success in the sales ring with his first crop bringing an average of \$108,448 this year.

"Audible is a beautiful horse himself, a good racehorse, and he is passing on some of his looks to his foals," said Ben Berger, who signed the ticket for the filly. "They walk well and seem to have good minds on them. The market seems to like them, so we will see what the market thinks next year."

Conversely, some buyers are seeing difficulty getting horses in their price range.

"The market is strong, I have followed many up and they have gone past \$100,000," Donald Wells commented. "We just went past \$100,000 and still didn't get one."

Before the final day of selling for Book 4 began Tuesday at Keeneland, WinStar Farm hosted a preview of the horses of racing age training on their track, sending sets out at 9:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. to showcase offerings from the WinStar Racing, Taylor Made Sales Agency, and Grovendale consignments.

These horses, among 290 horses of racing age cataloged, will sell Nov. 19 in the final session of Book 5. Book 5 begins Nov. 17 with Hips 2660-3057 set to sell beginning at 10:00 a.m. ET. BH

With 22 mares already secured through Nov. 16 at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, Chris Larsen's expanding Three C Thoroughbreds is hoping to make 40 purchases by the time the auction wraps up Nov. 19.

Larsen is the CEO of Halmar International, a New York-based civil construction company with projects ranging from the IBM Headquarters and Semiconductor Facility to the foundation and superstructure of the World Trade Center. He got into horse racing as a West Point Thoroughbreds partner, but over the past 10 years or so expanded his interests beyond racing to the breeding game. Along with a broodmare band, he stands two young sires in Fog of War and Galilean at Questroyal/Hidden Lake Farm near Stillwater, N.Y. Fog of War stood his first season in 2021, while Galilean will begin his stud career in 2022.

Martha Jane Mulholland of Mulholland Springs is purchasing mares at Keeneland on Larsen's behalf.

"We are looking to buy 40 horses at this sale. We bought 28 last year at the (Keeneland) November sale,"

she said. "It's a challenge this year. Mr. Larsen has definite breeding patterns, bloodlines he likes to do. We are very selective."

Last year's mares cost gross receipts of \$871,500. This year, \$793,000 has been spent for the current purchases. The newly acquired mares will foal in New York at Hidden Lake Farm with Chris Bernhard, who also serves as Larsen's bloodstock advisor, and 2022 mating plans will be penciled in.

The mares purchased over the last two weeks were carefully selected by Larsen, who runs his operation with a hands-on approach. His top purchase so far at this sale is the \$102,000 Mizzen Mast mare Parol, who was consigned as Hip 2231 by Claiborne Farm, which co-owned and co-bred her with Adele Dilschneider. Parol set a course record at Gulfstream Park at 4, going 7 1/2 furlongs on turf in 1:28.32. She has produced two foals and was sold in foal to War of Will.

The other purchases made under the name Halmar International range from \$15,000-\$60,000. A key purchase at the top of that range is the Dynaformer mare Glamour and Style, consigned as Hip 1265 by Lane's End, agent, and mated to Improbable. Her full sister, Somewhat, was a group 1 winner in Australia for Godolphin and her half sister, Art Deco, was a group 3 winner in England.

A proponent and supporter of the New York-bred incentive program, Larsen is playing the long game of bringing fashionable commercial stallions to New York.

"He is 50-50 on breeding to race and sell. There is a significant commitment to racing, but he wants to make the business make sense," Mulholland said. "He has a long-range goal of where he wants to be. He has been brewing in the industry... growing, growing, growing. He is someone I think we need in the industry and for the New York program."

Mulholland said that in 2022 she plans to send a few mares to Galilean and possibly sell a few with Bernhard in New York at the regional sales.

"The New York program is amazing. You can run for significant purses up there in a limited pool of horses," Mulholland said.

Galilean will stand for an advertised fee of \$7,000 his first year at stud. The son of Uncle Mo was a

six-time black-type winner and also grade 2-placed. He will stand in partnership with West Point Thoroughbreds, who were also a co-owner during Galilean's race career.

Fog of War, a son of War Front and winner of the Summer Stakes (G1T) for owner Peter Brant, stood for a \$7,000 fee this year as the property of Brant's White Birch Farm and Three C Stables. BH

ENGAGE TO STUD AT NORTHVIEW STALLION STATION

Multiple graded stakes-winning sprinter Engage has been retired to Northview Stallion Station in Chesapeake City, Md., for the 2022 season. He will stand for \$5,000.

A son of champion sire Into Mischief, Engage began his career with trainer Chad Brown before joining Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen. During his 4-year-old season in 2019, he notched his signature victory in the Stoll Keenon Ogden Phoenix Stakes (G2) at Keeneland, defeating Whitmore, Lexitonian, Hog Creek Hustle, and Promises Fulfilled. The win earned a Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) berth that fall, where he finished fourth behind Mitole at Santa Anita Park.

He hit the board three times this year in allowance optional claiming races and retires with a 5-5-2 record from 19 starts, earning \$802,780 for Woodford Racing.

"This horse is pure speed," said Northview general manager David Wade. "He is the first true sprinter we've retired to Northview in years."

Besides his achievements as an older horse, Engage won the Futurity (G3) in 2017 as a juvenile

at Belmont Park. The next year at 3, he won the Gold Fever Stakes and placed in three graded stakes.

Engage represents the successful pedigree cross of Into Mischief with Speightstown mares, a combination that has yielded such top performers as grade 1 winners Mia Mischief and Mischevious Alex. Engage's dam, the stakes-placed Nefertiti, is out of three-time graded winner Clearly a Queen. BH

\$2M EARNER SLEEPY EYES TODD TO STUD AT SWIFTY FARMS

Thumbs Up Racing and Indiana stallion farm Swifty Farms will introduce Sleepy Eyes Todd to breeders in the Midwest and Kentucky for the 2022 breeding season. He will stand at Swifty Farms for an advertised fee of \$3,500 stands and nurses.

After running at 11 U.S. racetracks in 10 states and traveling to two countries in the Middle East, the 5-year-old son of Paddy O'Prado is ready to set down some roots. The \$2 million-earning stallion arrived at the Seymour, Ind., farm over the weekend and already has his owner, David Cobb of Thumbs Up Racing, revved up for the prospects of his new chapter.

"(Indiana) is the perfect place for us, and I'm excited to get going with (his) stallion career," said Cobb.

The horse retires sound and healthy, according to his connections.

"I could have taken him to a number of places, but I really do believe that regional breeding programs are the best game in town, and Indiana has a very strong program," Cobb added. "I spoke with a number

of Indiana connections, including Christine Cagle of Springcliff Farm and Jerri Harmon, Swifty's new stallion manager, and it just felt right to bring him to Indiana."

Both Cobb and Sleepy Eyes Todd's longtime trainer, Miguel Silva, plan to breed their mares to the gray stallion to take advantage of the Indiana-sired program.

"The biggest benefit to Indiana is the close proximity to Kentucky," Cobb said. "And I believe that Kentucky breeders are looking for better bargains."

Sleepy Eyes Todd finished his career with 20 starts, eight wins, three seconds, and a third, and earnings of \$2,051,725. Bred by Two Hearts Farm and Kristen Goncharoff, he recorded his first black-type score in 2019 in taking the Jeffrey A. Hawk Memorial Stakes at Remington Park. The next year he expanded his resume by adding the Bosselman Pump and Pantry/Gus Fonner Stakes at Fonner Park, the Charles Town Classic Stakes (G2) at Hollywood Casino at Charles Town Races, the Lafayette Stakes Presented by Keeneland Select at Keeneland on the Breeders' Cup undercard, and in the closing race of his 4-year-old season, the Mr. Prospector Stakes (G3) at Gulfstream Park.

This year during his 5-year-old season, he was winless in five starts, though he performed well in top company, running fourth in the Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1) at Gulfstream and fifth in the Saudi Cup at King Abdulaziz Racecourse. He then wound down his career with a 10th in the Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (G1) at Meydan, a third in the Bosselman Pump and Pantry/ Gus Fonner Stakes, and a second during a title defense in the Charles Town Classic. He continued to breeze through late October at Keeneland.

"'Sleepy' has definitely shown that he is game enough to race on any track, any continent, and any distance," Cobb said. "That's what I'm hoping Indiana breeders are looking for." BH

WALSH CALLS FOR TESTS ON WARWICK RAID SAMPLES

Ruby Walsh has called for samples to be retrospectively tested for any banned substances seized from equine therapist John Warwick at a premises near Monasterevin, County Kildare last week.

Speaking on RTE 2FM's Game On show, Walsh also called on Jim Bolger, the Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine, and the Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board to share any knowledge of illegal remedies in order to help catch drug cheats in racing.

Bolger said earlier this year that drugs are Irish racing's number one problem and predicted there would be a Lance Armstrong moment in the sport, and Walsh called on the trainer to reveal everything he knows to aid the IHRB in catching anyone who breaks the rules.

"I would have liked Jim Bolger to come out and name the product," Walsh said. "To say people are using something or are cheating; you can't accuse someone if you don't know what they are at. That's what anybody who is trying to catch drug cheats needs, is the name of the product, so they can test for it and catch the people who are using it."

Walsh added: "If the Department of Agriculture, Food, and Marine and the Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board have found substances in Monasterevin last week, they can retrospectively test all the samples they have taken. They have taken numerous hair and blood samples from loads of horses all over the country and I'm assuming they have stored them.

"So, if they have products now, they can retrospectively test and therefore we will find out who is and who isn't. The proof will be in the eating. I never minded what Jim Bolger said. I would have liked the name of something. If you know, tell the people in charge what you know to allow them to catch the people who are cheating. Nobody wants to be playing or participating or watching an unlevel playing field so, if you know it, say it."

Reports claim that a group of British-based trainers hired a private investigator to stake out Warwick's premises, leading to the seizure of the prohibited substances Nov. 9. However, Walsh believes such a suggestion is far-fetched.

He said: "I think that's a bit fanciful. The man in question is British. I mean, he's hardly just working here. He works on both sides of the Irish Sea. Is he doing one thing here and another in Britain? I don't think so. I don't believe that one. I'm more inclined to believe that whatever he was getting was followed in through customs and the department followed it to see where it was going."

Walsh added: "I think racing is no different to every other sport in the world. There will be people who are trying to get an advantage and there will be people using things they shouldn't be using. I'm not naïve enough to think that racing is squeaky clean. I think it's like every other sport in the world."

Warwick, 74, has worked over the years across many equine disciplines, with his laser treatment of tendon problems reportedly one of his specialist areas for racehorses. He is credited for nursing 2010 Darley Irish Oaks (G1) winner Snow Fairy back to full health following a potential career-ending injury.

Patrick Cooper, racing manager for Snow Fairy's owner Cristina Patino, has outlined Warwick's role in the Ed Dunlop-trained star's rehabilitation.

He said: "It's a long time ago. Yes, he did treat the filly, absolutely. There's never any drugs involved and he just does the laser treatment—they don't even get sedated for it. There shouldn't be any drugs involved in that particular process and there never has been as far as I know."

He added: "Warwick got the credit (for Snow Fairy's return) and he does seem to be able to do things with tendons that others can't do, so he gets used. It was a serious leg injury on a serious horse so it was a case of what are we going to do? Are we going to retire her?

"Then somebody came up with his name—it could have been from any field as he doesn't just treat Thoroughbreds—and everyone said he was the go-to man so we went to him. It's very unusual for a horse to come back and do what she did after the injury that she had, so credit to him for that."

CAMELOT COLT LEADS SECOND DAY OF GOFFS NOVEMBER TRADE

Pinhookers continued to clash over the prime offerings at the Goffs November Foal Sale Nov. 16 as trade went through the gears.

The second lively session in as many days brought turnover of \bigcirc 7,374,500 (US\$8,426,680), a 50% yearon-year increase; an average of \bigcirc 34,460 (\$39,376), 23% increase; and a median of \bigcirc 28,000 (\$31,995), up 40%. The clearance rate was 84% as 214 foals found a new home.

The familiar figures of Camas Park Stud's Timmy Hyde and Michael Fitzpatrick of Kilminfoyle House Stud fought out the closing stages of the bidding for Airlie Stud's son of Camelot (Lot 434) who topped the session, with the former winning out at €170,000 (\$194,255).

The colt's catalog page features just two dams, as his own, the winning Invincible Spirit mare The Fairy, is out of Cinnamon Rose, whose brood includes Moyglare Stud Stakes (G1) heroine Chelsea Rose.

That daughter of Desert King not only won a group 1 during her time on the racecourse but has since started a dynasty of her own, with her five black-type offspring

a dynasty of her own, with her five black-ty headed by William Hill St. Leger (G1) and Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris (G1) scorer Kew Gardens.

"He's a lovely horse with a lovely pedigree, it's a proper family," said Hyde, who confirmed his purchase was made with resale in mind. "We've been lucky with the sire before. Hopefully he'll be another Russian Camelot."

Airlie Stud has enjoyed a productive time of it at the November Foal Sale, having also sold a Zoustar colt (Lot 269) to Yeomanstown Stud for €90,000 (\$102,841) Tuesday and a Starspangledbanner filly (Lot 125) to Glenvale Stud for €62,000 (\$70,941) on day one. "It's a family we've had for a while and this was a lovely colt," said the stud's Anthony Rogers. "He's very straightforward with a beautiful temperament and is by a very good sire. I'm still digesting it but it's been a good week."

He added: "Cinnamon Rose was the first horse who ran in my colors. Gerry Cusack trained her, she was also the first winner in my colors when she won at Roscommon. Unfortunately she had an accident and she wasn't quite the same after that but she had a lot of ability."

The O'Callaghan family from Tally-Ho Stud hung around to secure the last lot into the ring on Monday, the session-topping Mehmas colt (Lot 245) who fetched €140,000 (\$160,191), and the same team were back in action early on Tuesday when they gave €130,000 (\$148,548) for the Exceed And Excel colt out of the listed-placed Ejaazah (Lot 247).

The youngster was offered by The Castlebridge Consignment on behalf of Shadwell Estates, who also sold the colt's half brother Elsals, who finished third on his debut at York, to Kevin Philippart de Foy for 140,000 guineas (\$202,345) at the recent Tattersalls Autumn Horses in Training Sale.

After two days of action Tally-Ho Stud was out clear at the head of the leading buyers' chart, with the O'Callaghans having signed for 11 foals at an outlay of €759,000 (\$867,293).

Aughamore Stud in Action

Brothers Michael and Laurence Gleeson of Aughamore Stud in County Westmeath got among the action when they combined with Howson and Houldsworth Bloodstock at €120,000 (\$137,121) to secure the Camelot colt out of Lady Magdala (Lot 320).

Offered by Stanley Lodge and bred by John Kennedy, the March-born youngster is the first foal out of the Teofilo half sister to three black-type performers, namely Godolphin Flying Start Zetland Stakes (G3) scorer Max Vega and the listed-placed pair Camphor and Quickstep Girl.

"We're big fans of the stallion and we thought this was an outstanding individual," said Michael Gleeson. "He comes from a good home at Stanley Lodge too; we got a good result with a Mastercraftsman we bought off them last year (bought for €50,000, resold for 140,000 guineas).

"We've had a brilliant year selling so we'll try to do the same in 2022, and this colt is one to look forward to bringing back next year."

Although the colt was not bred by the team behind Stanley Lodge, William Kennedy, who owns the Cashel farm with John Wall, explained that he has a particularly close association with the pedigree, having bred Max Vega and his high-performing siblings from

Paraphernalia, a listed-placed daughter of Dalakhani who joined the broodmare band at a cost of 135,000 guineas (\$231,833) in 2013.

"He's a lovely horse," Kennedy said of the Camelot colt. "He moves so well and has been very popular here so we're delighted for the owner. The mare doesn't board with us but we have the whole family as we bought Paraphernalia and bred all her foals. We know the pedigree inside out.

"He's a bigger model than others in the family as they're generally a bit Dalakhani-like, light, and a bit narrow. They're all very good runners though with good minds and are all very good in terms of physique, wind, and limbs."

MESSIER RISES UP FOR EMPIRE MAKER

The bold decision made by Gainesway to repatriate Empire Maker from Japan for the 2016 breeding season didn't really reap the reward the initiative shown deserved when the stallion died early in 2020.

After just four seasons at his new home, and from the three Gainesway crops he sired prior to his passing there has so far emerged just five stakes winners from 160 starters, and just one U.S. grade 1 scorer, the American Pharoah Stakes (G1) scorer Eight Rings. (La Poetisa, like Eight Rings, from Empire Maker's 2017 crop, did take the Premio Las Oaks (G1) in Chile.)

The story isn't completely written, however, as there are over 100 foals in Empire Maker's final crop yearlings of 2021—and of his penultimate crop which numbers 94, only 21 have so far started. Of those, seven are winners, and they include the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) third Haughty, and Messier, who followed up an eye-catching second start maiden win with a comfortable victory in the Nov. 14 Bob Hope Stakes (G3) at Del Mar.

As a racehorse and a sire, Empire Maker stands with Unbridled's Song as one of two outstanding sons of Unbridled, the champion 3-year-old colt of 1990.

Empire Maker lost out to Funny Cide in the ballot for the champion 3-year-old male title but was probably the best second-season performer of his crop. He took the runner-up spot behind Funny Cide in the Kentucky Derby (G1) following an interrupted preparation, but defeated that rival in the Wood Memorial Stakes (G1) and Belmont Stakes (G1), and had earlier won the Florida Derby (G1), making him the only colt of the crop to take three grade 1 events at 3.

Empire Maker retired to stand at Juddmonte Farms in Lexington in 2004, but was purchased by the Japan Bloodhorse Breeders' Association, and stood at Shizunai Stallion Station from 2011-15. One of the reasons for his sale was that he'd been far less successful for Juddmonte—who bred quite a high proportion of middle-distance turf mares to him—than for outside breeders. A disappointment during his time in Japan, Empire Maker left 11 grade 1 winners during his first spell in Kentucky, among them three-time Eclipse Award winner Royal Delta, Pioneerof the Nile (sire of Triple Crown victor American Pharoah), and Bodemeister.

Bred in Ontario by Sam-Son Farm, Messier comes from a family that has long been associated with that famous Canadian nursery. He is the first starter from three foals of racing age out of his dam Checkered Past, a daughter of Smart Strike who twice took the Trillium Stakes at Woodbine. Checkered Past is out of the A.P. Indy mare Catch the Flag, a sister to Canadian champion 2-year-old filly Catch the Thrill, herself dam of stakes winner Curlin's Catch—by Smart Strike's son Curlin, and so closely related to Checkered Past.

Curlin's Catch triumphed in the Suncoast Stakes at Tampa Bay Downs this year.

Messier's third dam, Catch the Ring, earned a title as champion 3-year-old filly in Canada. She was by Seeking the Gold out of Halo's daughter Radiant Ring, winner of nine black-type events, including the Matchmaker Stakes (G2T). That also makes Catch the Ring a sister to stakes winners Diamond Fever and Seeking the Ring, with Seeking the Ring going on to produce the Ontario Fashion Stakes (G3) and Whimsical Stakes (G3) scorer Southern Ring.

The dam of Radiant Ring, the minor stakes-placed Gleaming Stone, is a half sister Barb's Dancer, dam of the ill-fated champion sprinter Eillo, and their dam Periodista is also ancestress of grade 1 winners Gygistar and Flat Fleet Feet. A very close relative to Neapolitan Way, a graded stakes winner who took second in the 1974 Preakness Stakes (G1), Periodista is out of Swooning, a sister to Swoon's Son, a Hall of Famer and sire of Hall of Famer Chris Evert, and to the multiple stakes-winning Dogoon.

This is a rather interesting female line. In theory it is one of the branches of Bruce Lowe's #12 family going back to the Brimmer Mare foaled around 1695. However, the branch from which this family stems-the Montague Mare-was wrongly conflated with the Brimmer Mare family in the fifth edition of the first volume of the General Stud Book, something suggested by foaling dates, and confirmed by mitochondrial DNA analysis, showing the two branches are from different haplotypes (I2a2 for the Brimmer descendants and L1a from the wrongly attributed branch that goes back to The Montague Mare).

Further study reveals that Messier

is from an entirely different mitochondrial line from either-the far less common A1 haplotype. It appears his distant female line ancestress, a mare by Jack of Diamonds foaled in 1765, was wrongly added to the offspring of the imported mare Diana, who descends from The Montague Mare. The branch from which Messier stems produced some notables in the relatively early days of American racing, including one of the most famous American runners and sires of all time. Lexington, as well Hall of Fame horse Luke Blackburn; 1877 Kentucky Derby captor Baden-Baden; Leonatus, who took the Kentucky Derby in 1883; the 1886 Preakness Stakes scorer The Bard: Foxford, the Belmont Stakes winner in 1891; Ildrim, successful in the Belmont Stakes in 1900; Lady Schorr, who lifted the Kentucky Oaks in 1901; Souffle, who took the Kentucky Oaks in 1896; and finally Kalitan, who won the Preakness Stakes in 1917.

There are some more recent standouts in other parts of the world, among them the great Australian horse Kingston Town, and in Europe, Ouija Board and her son Australia. The branch that leads to Messier had been bumping along at a fairly modest level until Swooning's third dam, Silk Lady, was bred to Greenock—a fairly obscure sire, but stemming also from the A1 haplotype to produce Swooning's second dam, Sadie Greenock, and the revival in its fortunes began.

To return to more modern pedigree connections: Messier is obviously a Triple Crown trial prospect at this time, and should he prevail in a classic, it won't be the first for the combination of his sire line, Unbridled, with his broodmare sire line, Smart Strike. The 2009 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) victor, Mine Than Bird, was by Unbridled's grandson, Birdstone, out of a mare by Smart Strike, and his half brother, the multiple grade 1 winner and Kentucky Derby third Dullahan, was by another Unbridled grandson, Even the Score. BH
